## VIEW FROM THE HILL

Our Unitarian Universalist faith leads people to



action. The stories of our religious tradition
show the accomplishments of our
spiritual ancestors to create an
environment of

freedom of belief *and* their acting in the world according to shared values and principles. In our time, our efforts continue to recreate and maintain this environment.

In Georgia, many Unitarian Universalists have joined with people from other faith or secular traditions as allies to act together on our shared value of the inherent worth and dignity of all persons. Together, we have opposed the death penalty in general and advocated for one Troy Anthony David specifically. I believe, along with many others, that Troy is an innocent person who has been on Georgia's death row for seventeen years.

And so we act with rallies, marches, and letter or email writing initiatives, in order to prevent an injustice from occurring. Yet, time and time again we failed. We failed at the Georgia Court of Appeals, we failed in the U.S. Court of Appeals, we failed at the Georgia Supreme Court, and we failed at the Georgia Board of Pardons and Paroles. Troy's date of execution is Tuesday, September 23.

Still, we continue to act because it is the right thing to do, regardless of the outcome of our ac-

tion. The agitation on behalf of Troy Davis may shed some light on Georgia's abysmal justice system. He is not the first, nor the last African-American man in the U.S. wrongly accused of a capital crime and given an inadequate public defense. Maybe our actions will show the illogic of the state killing people to show that killing people is wrong. Maybe we demonstrated that people of differing faith traditions can share the same values.

If it is the right thing to do, then we have to act, especially when our principles and values are challenged. When it isn't clear whether something is right or not, we can turn to each other for wisdom, for insight, and for affirmation or correction. This is what a religious community does, it creates and maintains an environment of freedom of belief and the mutual support of each member to act on shared values and principles. This is preferable in my mind to standing alone. Let us continue to stand together in love.

# TRANSYLVANIA CONNECTIONS: From Benced to Hanska

During the September 21, 2008 church service, the Nora congregation affirmed and endorsed a church project to help reconnect Nora to our sister church in Benced, Romania. Our church will sponsor a visit from the Benced Unitarian Religious Educator coordinator, Krisztina Pall, in February 2009. While in Minnesota, Krisztina will deliver a Sunday message at Nora. She will also fly to Texas to participate in the UU Women's conference.

We are committed to raise \$3,000-\$3,500 to support this trip. Committees have already been very generous with their support: The Women's Society has pledged \$1000, Board \$500-\$1000, Social Justice committee \$1000. A grant application for \$500 will be submitted to the Partner Church Council soon. In addition to the monetary commitment, we will need Nora families to open their homes and dinner tables to host Krisztina and offer her Minnesota experiences!


