If you've been in church on any Sunday that Jerry Peterson has attended, you've noticed his friendly smile, cheery disposition, and boundless enthusiasm. He's a great conversationalist to boot! I called Jerry for the purpose of sharing some of his background with the readers of MereLys. In future newsletters I'll do articles on other recent newcomers.

Jerry lives in Springfield, having purchased his "perfect place" two years ago while visiting his mother who was then in the nursing home. Jerry grew up in Springfield so he's come full circle back to his roots. Jerry is an ordained Methodist minister. He has spent over 25 years serving as a minister of children and youth. He continues to conduct weddings, baptisms, and funerals whenever the need arises. As many bonds were created over the years of youth ministry, it is not unusual for him to get a call from some of these young folks asking for his ministerial services.

Jerry's religious training was at Hamline and Boston University both of which are of a more liberal Methodist heritage. He became familiar with Unitarianism while in Boston and in the Twin Cities. Upon his return to Springfield Jerry visited several area churches.

He was quite surprised to find an ad for Nora Church in the Journal and fondly remembers driving all around Hanska looking for the church. When he stopped at the gas station for directions he was told, "It's the church in the cornfield."

Jerry appreciates the UU Sunday services. He states that every service provides an opportunity for each person to find individual meaning. IN MEMORY

Helen Haugen Lodes Merville passed away Jan. 26, 2009, in Columbia Heights, MN. A memorial Service was held at the United Church of Christ, Hutchinson, MN on Saturday, June 13. Algot and Bonita Blomquist joined relatives and close friends for the service.

Helen was delivered by her father, a homesteader, Jan. 8, 1910 in a log cabin in Walker, MN. In June, 1910 the family, including her sister Doris, moved to Hanska, MN, always referred to as "home."

In 1911, her brother Henrik was born. "Where you saw one you say the other," an inseparable pair. Doris taught them her school lessons and thanks to those lessons Helen passed through the 3rd and 8th grade. At age 16 she became a country school teacher in Brown County and was honored by the Brown county Historical Society in 2003 as the oldest living country school teacher in Brown County.

She married Eugene Lodes, June 19, 1932. In 1939 they opened a hardware and appliance business in Hutchinson, MN. In 1941, they welcomed the birth of Sandra Gene. Helen was widowed on May 13, 1943 and, under difficult circumstances, continued to very successfully manage Lodes Hardware and Appliance Store, which she sold in 1959.

Helen married Raymond Merville in 1969. They resided in Watertown, Wis., where he sister Doris and husband Roy lived. Helen enjoyed those years close to her sister. Following Raymond's death in 1991, she moved to Minneapolis to be near her family. Her greatest thrill was her two grandchildren, Kimberly and Corey, and great grandchildren, Eric, Zachary and Jacqueline.

A highly dignified, intelligent, witty and respected grand lady, a beloved mother and grandmother, to her family, she will always remain our dear "Grandma Honey."

Helen was preceded in death by parents, Inga and Siver Haugen; sister Doris Pfeiffer, brother Henrik Haugen; husbands

Gene Lodes and Raymond Merville. She is survived by daughter, Sandra Langer (Michael); grandchildren, great grandchildren and nieces and nephews.

Patricia M Erickson was born Jun. 21, 1935 at Hanska, MN to Alvin and Myrtle (Paulson) Strom. She graduated from Hanska High School and attended Macalester College where she received a Teaching Certificate. Pat then taught school at New Ulm, Fairfax and Hector for several years. She married Donald J. Erickson on June 16, 1957 at Nora Church in Hanska and they have made their home in Olivia ever since. Pat was employed as an executive secretary for Trojan Seed Co. in Olivia for many years after which she was founding member and part owner of Keltgen Seed Co. in Olivia. After her retirement Pat enjoyed being a bailiff for the Renville County Court House. She was a faithful member of Faith United Methodist Church in Olivia where she often assisted with the funeral committee. Pat enjoyed playing cards, bowling, golfing, doing cross-stitch, traveling and especially family gatherings.

Pat is survived by her husband, Donald Erickson of Olivia, her five children and their families: James and Lynn Erickson of Belle Plaine, and grandchildren Benjamine, Adam and Anna; Julie and Jim Kohout of Olivia and grandchildren Craig and Jason; Jeanne and Bill Welchance of Mufreesboro, TN, and grandchildren Samuel and Daniel and step-grandchildren Ginny and Evan; Joanne and Dan Reinert of Olivia and grandchildren Rachel and Liza; Jon Erickson of Olivia; and her brother Michael (and Judy) Strom of Watertown, SD. Pat was preceded in death by her parents and her sister Shirley Nelson.

Memorial Services were held June 8, 2009 at the Faith United Methodist Church in Olivia, MN. Many friends and relatives from the Hanska area attended.
