





Some of my friends (and some of yours, too, no doubt) have added that appellation to their Facebook names in response to the filibuster that prevented a vote to repeal “don’t ask don’t tell” as the law of the United States military regarding homosexuality.

A reporter on Minnesota Public Radio asked the archbishop why the Catholic Church hasn’t tried to get the state to outlaw divorce, since, as he says, it is every bit as much “against God’s law” as same sex marriage. The archbishop willfully misunderstood the question each time the reporter rephrased it.

An appeals court ruled Florida’s ban on adoption by gay people unconstitutional and Gov. Crist said the state would stop enforcing the law banning such adoptions.

All this just this week, and it is only Thursday afternoon!

A good friend calls her spouse both her “starter wife” and her “trophy wife,” noting that

they were married ceremonially in one state and then, a few months later, legally in another state. My friend’s characteristic humor and grace lead the way every time, but the anger, the sadness, the frustration are there, not far beneath the surface. And sometimes not beneath the surface at all.

You all know my favorite bit of Unitarian Universalist theology by now: *we need not think alike to love alike* (Francis David, 16th century Transylvania). To me it seems self-evident that it is just as true that *we need not love alike to love alike*.

Listen in your head for just a minute to all the great love songs written or performed by songwriters and artists we used to think (used to pretend) were straight... Do they sound less true, less lovely, less heartfelt now that you know about the writers’, performers’ sexual orientation and affectional preference?

Popular love songs aren’t evidence or proof of anything. But our lived experiences are. Our voices are. And our votes certainly are. Every day I wake up determined to put my voice and my vote to better use. I hope you’ll join me.




