#### **WELL UPDATE**

Darrel sent in the application for the Minnesota Dept. of Health grant for the new well. We won't know if we will receive a grant until the first part of May. The grant, if received, will cover 50% of the total cost of the project. The total cost is \$9742.50. We want to raise the money that is needed through



voluntary contributions, as opposed to taking it out of the reserves. Your donation would be over and above your church pledge. The project will begin as soon as we receive news about the grant. Grant or not this is something that has to be done. We do not need the money until the project is completed, but

want to make sure we can cover it then. We will let you know about the status of the grant when we are notified.
