VIEW FROM THE HILL



"... and on the other hand she had a wart."

Have you heard that expression (or used it yourself)? You and

some other folks are debating an issue, perhaps the pros and cons of eating before a late movie or having a leisurely meal after a matinee. Or vacationing at the mountains versus exploring a big city. Or whether or not to accept a job offer. Or how to vote in an upcoming election. On the one hand...but on the other hand.... The debate goes on for a while, all sides considered and reconsidered. Then someone gets weary or runs out of idea and out it comes, "...on the other hand she had a wart."

Endless discussion of options, hours even days and weeks of examining an idea or a problem or a possibility from every imaginable angle and perspective can get tiresome. It can allow us to delay making a difficult decision we'd rather not have to make. In many situations there just comes a time when we have to stop. Acknowledge that we are never going to be one hundred percent, absolutely certain. Accept that there are some factors we're never going to be able to know or predict. Or, that even with all possible information, the ultimate decision is still, finally, a leap of faith. There almost always comes a time to call a halt to looking at things from another direction.

But (on the other hand), just as often, it seems, we come too quickly to that point. Often we (or at least, I) call a halt to the deliberations and the discussion before we really have examined all the options and looked at things from even two or three different directions instead of just one. Sometimes we're in a hurry. Sometimes we just want to be right and know that if we keep looking we might discover we're wrong-or only partly right. Sometimes we're lazy. Or uneasy with the conflict that comes from considering more than one point of view. (I'm in the middle of that last situation as I write. Against both my better judgment and my usual self-imposed rules, I reposted a poster on Facebook and it is generating a lot more discussion than I find comfortable!)

Still, often on a Sunday afternoon I reflect on the sermon I've just preached and find it lacking because I know there are five or six more sides or angles or points of view I could have explored. So I'm excited about our plans to explore themes in worship this church year. All the Sunday services in any given month will center on a single theme, challenging me and our program committee members to go deeper, to seek further, to look again and a third time and a fourth time. I'm looking forward to the adventure. May it prove enlightening to us all.
