THANKS FROM THE BOARD

Thanks from the board this month goes to Pat Kunerth for serving on the Prairie Beacon Board.

PRAIRIE BEACON

Prairie Beacon is the corporation that owns and operates the turbine at Nora Church. The church is the owner of the corporation. We have started posting monthly kwh production and monthly income from both Nora Church and Alliant Energy on the bulletin board. Nora Church pays Prairie Beacon for the church's electrical usage. The excess is sold to Alliant Energy.

Since starting nearly two years ago we have produced over 50,000 kwh of electricity. Monthly production in January, February, and March 2013 has ranged from 2,200 to 2,400 kwh. Monthly income for that period has averaged over \$200 per month. Fixed costs for insurance and interest are \$190. so it's nice for Prairie Beacon to be paying its own way.

On April 14, 2013 Prairie Beacon will have our third annual shareholder meeting with the Nora Church board. They have appointed Mark Wiger, Lee Droge-muller, Darrell Hinsman, and Glen Hokenson as officers of the corporation. This group meets monthly to take care of routine business. We are available for questions and appreciate the support of the congregation.
