### VIEW FROM THE HILL

...inside the Crack all things are as one. The eternal opposites meet and kiss. The wolf and the lamb lie down together, the dove and the serpent share one nest. The stars bend down and touch the earth and the young and the old forgive each other. Night and day meet here, so do the poles. The East leans over toward the West and the circle is complete. This is the time and place...the only time and the only place—where everybody lives happily ever after.

In *Mary Poppins Opens the Door*, author P. L. Travers includes a chapter, titled "Happily Ever After", telling what happens between the first stroke of midnight on New Year's Eve and the last stroke of midnight on New Year's Eve.

During that crack of time, between the Old Year and the New Year, in the enchanted world of Mary Poppins, storybook characters are released from their pages, toys escape the toybox, and they all come to life—but with a twist. The Three Blind Mice and the Farmer's Wife are friends; Little Miss Muffet converses with the Spider; and Humpty Dumpty is whole. And so on.

We, unfortunately, live in neither the Crack nor the wider world of Mary Poppins. But wholeness, oneness, and happily-ever-after don't have to be outside our reach. We are approaching (as I write this column) the time when the Old Year and the New Year meet. And we are faced with the decision (as indeed we are everyday) about how we will meet the New Year and live within it. Will we live fractured lives, estranged from the people who mean the most to us, working madly and rushing after false goals? Or will we make gestures of reconciliation, slow down, reassess our priorities and move our lives into alignment with them?

A more traditional source of wisdom than Mary Poppin once said, "Be the change you wish to see in the world" (Gandhi). At this time of making resolutions, I invite you to make one simple resolution this year, which, if fulfilled, will help you move your life and the world closer to the happily-ever-after of the Crack: resolve to come to church. Here, together, we

will do our best to promote and nurture oneness, the wholeness of the circle, and happily-ever-afters in the real world, lasting beyond the final stroke of midnight.
