A VISIT TO AL SWANSON

Algot and Bonita stopped to visit Al Swanson in Worthington on Saturday, October 16th. Al is currently a resident at the Crossroads Nursing Home

where many of his former students are caregivers. Al was not having a good day when we were there but the nurses assured us that on his better days he is the same jovial Al that we have all learned to know and love. We then drove to Luverne where we were joined by our daughter, Patsy, as we traveled to Hills. Mn where we visited with Vernon Iverson who lives there in an assisted living apartment. He is 91 years "young" with a sharp mind and appears to be in reasonably good health. He can get up from his chair with much more ease than either of us can. He appreciates very much that many of the residents in his complex are Norwegian and can speak the language. He had one very close friend with whom he spent much time daily, who died in his sleep the previous week. He said he really misses his daily visits but at the same time appreciates very much the almost daily visits of his nephew, Ralph Iverson and his wife, who live in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. His family is a very important part of Nora Church history and he has many memories of traveling to Nora for the Sunday activities. We encourage anyone who knows Al or Vernon and are in the neighborhood to stop in and visit them.

YEAR END PLEDGE GIVING

Our number of pledge cards returned was very low this year. It's not too late...if you would still like to return yours, please do so. It helps the financial committee in planning our budget.

GRANT COMES THROUGH

On November 9th Nora Church received word that Prairie Beacon was successful in their USDA Small Wind grant application for \$20,000 toward the cost of an alternative energy production system. The congregation voted at their annual meeting to proceed with this wind project if we were successful with the grant.

Things have moved very quickly since that point. The selected contractor was Energy Concepts (web site energyconcepts.us) of Hudson, Wisconsin, and they were anxious to get started with cement work before winter sets in. The footings and bases for the three legs were poured on Nov 18th and will need to cure for 30 days. This was done ahead of the planned ground breaking on Sunday Nov 21. The electrical lines were also dug from the tower located on the south side of Mt. Pisqua to the north side of the parish hall. This is where the electrical inverter will be located.

A Jacobs 31-20 generator (web site WITC.com) was selected. This is a 20kw generator with 31 foot blades. A 120 foot lattice tower will be delivered and depending upon the weather it may be constructed this winter. The tower is assembled on the ground with the generator and blades attached and will be raised by crane.

The project should be able to meet the church's electrical demand and with reverse metering through Alliant Energy provide green energy for others. The grant received will help make this form of producing electricity more cost competitive.

The congregation is excited to be embarking on this clean energy project which helps to make Nora Church literally a beacon on the prairie.




