### A VIEW FROM THE HILL



Visitors to my house inevitably ask about an irregularly shaped piece of heavy plasticky material hanging on my refrigerator. There's a clue on it--a pin bearing the yellow words "Standing on the Side of Love."

The scrap of material is a remnant of a gigantic *Standing on the Side of Love* banner that hung across the front of the Salt Place Convention Center in Salt Lake City, Utah, during the 2009 General Assembly of the Unitarian Universalist Association. During GA the banner came down in a wind storm and the Standing on the Side of Love folks decided to cut it up and pass out the pieces to any delegates who wanted a piece.

The Unitarian Universalist Association's *Standing on the Side of Love* campaign "seeks to harness love's power to stop oppression." The campaign utilizes community activism, social networking, and media outreach make love real in the world. If you were at GA in Minneapolis last June, or followed coverage on-line or television, you probably remember the golden yellow t-shirts worn by thousands of UUs who witnessed on behalf of marriage equality at Loring Park. Those same Standing on the Side of Love t-shirts also made headlines in Arizona, at protests of the harsh SB1070, and other events where justice was at stake.

Standing on the Side of Love also encourages individuals, congregations and other groups to reimagine Valentine's Day, suggesting a National Standing on the Side of Love Day instead of the usual overly sentimental, highly romanticized day of candy and flowers. I doubt yellow will ever replace red and pink as the colors of Valentine's Day or love. But shifting our perspective, broadening our understanding of love and extending the reach of our love in new directions can hardly go wrong.

Love is powerful and tough and transformative. It's a job better suited, much of the time, to blue jeans, t-shirts and work-boots, than tuxedos or sexy lingerie. And those who stand on the side of love are on call round the clock, seven days a week. I'll still be sending pink and red hearts to my family and friends this month. But I'll also be on-call, ready to speak, write, stand on the side of love at a moment's notice. The sign fragment on my refrigerate reminds me that's part of my job. I hope you'll join me.
