VIEW FROM THE HILL



My dad loved to rouse the household on Christmas morning blasting Joy to the World from an LP that was old even in my earliest memories.

Those jubilant strains capture the essence of "the holidays" for me. So much of the popular message of the season is about joy.

Unbounded, gleeful anticipation of children awaiting Santa's arrival. "The most wonderful time of the year." Reunions and homecomings embellished with tears of joy. *The Hallelujah Chorus*. The sun's triumph over darkness. Oil for one night burning for eight nights in the newly reclaimed, rededicated temple. Sleigh bells ringing. Twinkling lights. Gasps of surprise on Christmas morning.

It *can* be the most wonderful time of the year, joy oozing with every heart beat.

It can also be exhausting, this overload of joyor more accurately, this overload of the expectation of joy. Sometimes these weeks between Thanksgiving and New Years, whether we call them the holidays or Advent and Christmas or Yule or Solstice or just December or December plus Hanukkah, sometimes these weeks between Thanksgiving and New Years seem nothing more than six weeks of stress or unmet expectation or loneliness or grief or commercialism, piling up, accumulating by the hour until we are buried, lost to the world and to ourselves.

To quote an old song quite unintentionally, It doesn't have to be that way. Even if I am the twenty-first century embodiment of Scrooge.

Even if jingle bells jangle my nerves. Even if I'm having a blue, blue Christmas without you (or worse yet, having a blue, blue Christmas despite being surrounded by my loved ones). Even if "the Christmas carols sound like blues But the choir is not to blame". Even if I'm not Christian, not Jewish, not Pagan. Even if I'm too rational and scientific to tolerate the nonsense about Santa and holy nights and miracles involving oil lamps. It doesn't have to be that way.

There is another sound that captures that essence of the holidays for me--one quite different from *Joy to the World*. It is the echo in my mind of my late minister reading the final line of a story each Christmas Eve of my childhood (come to Nora's Christmas Eve service if you want to hear the entire story): "'To my heart,' he said, 'there came a whisper.'"

It isn't easy to shut out the clamor of joy. It takes effort to maintain calm without resorting to *bah humbugs* or taking to bed. But we can breathe deeply. And remind ourselves that the whispers of our hearts have as much claim to the season as the songs and shouts of joy. We can come to church where we are guaranteed silence following the meditation. We can seek out the dark and the quiet and listen therein. We can cling to our sanity, our beliefs, our personal approach to the season as steadfastly as the shepherd in that story clung to his crook (you gotta come hear the story!). And we will be rewarded by peace, and perhaps even holy joy.

CHRISTMAS MORNING SERVICE


