VIEW FROM THE HILL



Poet Mary Oliver says:

To live in this world

you must be able

to do three things:

to love what is mortal;

to hold it against your bones

Knowing your own life depends on it;

and, when the time comes

to let it go, to let it go.

The prayer attributed to St. Francis says:
... it is in giving that we receive;
it is in pardoning that we are pardoned;
and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

And the poet W. H. Auden wrote: ... life is the destiny you are bound to refuse until you have consented to die.

The same wisdom appears over and over again, in contemporary poetry, in Western religion, in Eastern religion: the harder we clutch something, the faster it runs through our fingers and disappears. I know this observation is wise and true and oh so worthy of trying to apply to my life. But just at the moment I'm preferring the words of Anne Lamott. She writes of her infant grandson:

He also wants things now, and holds on - our two most human tendencies.

Oh, yeah. That's what *feels* true. And maybe it is true. Maybe that's why the wise ones so insistently urge us to behave otherwise; because they know our most human tendencies are to want and to hold. And they also know that sometimes, not always but often enough, wanting and holding (people or possessions or experiences or ways of being) are born of fear and so in the long run cannot possibly sustain joy or contentment or growth or safety or whatever it is we think they bring to our lives.

I'm not sure I'm ready to turn over a new leaf. To hold lightly to life and all its fleeting experiences. But I am ready to start paying greater attention. What do I want? What do I hold? What rewards do wanting and holding bring me? What happens when I let go? Maybe, just maybe, if my personal experience backs them up, I'll accept the wisdom of the teachers. And maybe the next time, I'll trust them without finding out the hard way first.
