VIEW FROM THE HILL

My uncle asked me this morning (via Facebook) if I'd ever tried lefse

with walleye. He's an ex-pat Minnesotan, quite happily adapted to life in Texas after more than 30 years, but he can't quite shake his craving for walleye and for lefse. I must say I'd crave walleye and lefse, too, if I lived far from easy access to the freshest and best of both. But Uncle Dick's question got me thinking mostly about the Thanksgiving table.

The turkey, stuffing or dressing, mashed potatoes, gravy, sweet potatoes or yams, green bean hotdish with french fried onions on top, cranberry relish or jelly, dinner rolls, pickles, pumpkin pie, apple pie, pecan pie. And lefse. Salmon. Tamales. Sticky rice. Grits. Okra. Corn pudding. Cannoli. Venison. Tofurkey. Creamed onions. Kim chi. Candied carrots. Hummus. Lasagna. Macaroni and cheese. Wild rice. Jell-O salad. I saw a billboard the other day that said, "Take Back America! Vote November 6". A passing vehicle obscured the part of the sign that showed who had paid for the message. I preferred it that way, weary as I am of a seemingly endless election season in which almost everyone seeking elected office has accused the other side (or those

already holding elected office) of hijacking our towns, cities, states and country from the real Americans to whom our home rightly belongs. With Columbus Day/ Indigenous Peoples' Day just past and Thanksgiving (along with simplified, sanitized allusions to the "first" American Thanksgiving feast) on the horizon, I am more aware than ever how troublesome it is to talk of real Americans, of who this country belongs to, of who belongs to this country, of what characterizes a truly American candidate, an American statesmen, an American family, an American feast. When we turn off the television, the radio, when we drop the more inflammatory of our Facebook friends and Twitter feeds, then the familiar sights and sounds of our neighbors, our schoolmates, our friends, our teachers and students, and our families begin to reassert themselves. Then we remember all the flavors we crave at our Thanksgiving feasts and weeknight dinners. Then we remember we were all once strangers in a strange land. Then we remember the strength and the beauty in our diversity-not abstractly, not because it is politically correct-but because we have lived it, we still live it. And we give thanks for it every day.

SIXTEEN. When you lose, don't lose the lesson!


SEVENTEEN. Remember the three R's: Respect for self; Respect for others; and responsibility for all your actions.


EIGHTEEN.. Don't let a little dispute injure a great friendship..


