VIEW FROM THE HILL

The newsletter deadline is December 20, so I am writing this column-even though it is wasted effort, since the world is going to end on December 21.

Or not. One (very long) cycle of the Mayan calendar comes to end on December 21 (or possibly 23) but that is a simple, clear-cut matter of time-keeping. - various predictions of Halley's Comet-caused doom in 1910.


Needless to say, the world survived every one of those doomsday dates and years. And chances are way better than even the world will survive this week, too. (You'll know it did if you're reading this column.)

Events in Connecticut in mid-December brought that reality into stark focus, but it is always there, on the edges of our awareness.

"So teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart," prayed the psalmist. There is some wisdom to that prayer. Knowledge of the fleeting nature of any pleasure, gift, or experience makes the pleasure sweeter, deeper, more precious. It can't be Christmas every day of the year or Saturday every day of the week. Likewise as mortals we cannot live forever, and it is good to know that our time for living, for loving, for serving, for learning and dancing and playing and working and making love and looking at the stars and screwing up, too, is limited. But we couldn't function, living with that acute awareness, very long.

Our personal doomsday will dawn. But probably not today and probably not tomorrow. And in the meantime the calendar will turn to another year and we'll get to make a new beginning, just because we want to. And Sunday will come round again and we'll get to gather in church, just because we want to. It's hard for me to think of a greater cause for happy celebration-even if the days are still getting shorter as I write, even some ancient calendar ends day after tomorrow.


Loose change on the 2nd Sunday of each month will go to "Food For All". Please consider a generous donation. Many are less fortunate than us and need a helping hand.


