Second Sunday Loose Offerings

For several years Nora Church has donated any non-pledge moneys collected on the second Sunday of each month to food banks in both Brown and Watonwon Counties. At its meeting in September the Board of Trustees voted to change the recipient of those second Sunday collection. For the remainder of the 2014/2015 church year (and until further notice) our second Sunday loose offer-

ings will go to support the New Ulm Area Ministerial Association Shelter House.

The New Ulm Area Ministerial Association (in which Lisa is an active participant and past president) is in the early stages of launching the Shelter House which will eventually provide temporary housing (up to 90 days) for single parents with children in the New Ulm Public Schools. The house, provided by First United Methodist Church, will have space for up to three families. Catholic Charities will provide case management for the families as they prepare to transition to more permanent housing.

The NUA Ministerial Association has submitted a grant to the Bush Foundation for start-up funds. In addition to dedicating second Sunday offerings to the House, the Nora Board also voted to furnish one room in the house. As the house is re-habbed and progress is made toward opening, Lisa will provide updates as well as information about opportunities for hands-on involvement in the project.


