

#### A VIEW FROM THE HILL

A random bit of advice (I have no idea where I read it or who offered it) to ministers preparing for the Christmas season keeps looping through my mind: “Just remember no one in the story was white.” I don’t describe or even mention race or skin color in my retelling of the Nativity story, but I was Mary in my church’s pageant, when I was a senior in high school—a very white, very fair, very Minnesotan Mary. So that reminder hits close to home in a way the smug and/or amusing reminders that Christmas is the pagan holiday on which we celebrate of the birth of a Middle Eastern Jew don’t quite do.

We get so much of the Nativity story “wrong”, if we are concerned with historical accuracy—or even likelihood. Mary’s visit to Elizabeth. The probable season of Jesus’ birth. The conflation of the birth narrative and the visit of the magi. The census. The star. The animals (maybe even talking animals, on that night and that night alone). And of course, countless depictions of non-Middle Eastern Holy Families in countless paintings, pageants, drawing, cartoons, needlepoint canvases, and Christmas cards through the ages.

We get so much of the Nativity story wrong, some will argue, that to pay attention to issues of race at Christmas is nothing more than misguided political correctness that will distract from the meaning of the season. I’m not interested in political correctness or even simple historical accuracy, however.

In times such as this, when so many are so ready to demonize the other, to fear the stranger, to distrust any overt gesture of deep faith (other than mainstream Protestantism or North American Catholicism)—in times such as this, it matters which parts of the story (**any** story) we choose to get right and which ones we consider too insignificant or inconsequential to be bothered with.

If we’re going to *sing peace on earth, to all good will*, we’d do well to intentionally expand our vision of *all*, and make manifest our smallest, most vital every day acts of *peace*. If we’re going to sing, *son (child) of God, love’s pure light*, we’d do well to remember all the hues and shapes and genders and ages and nationalities of *love*. If we’re going to sing, *the hopes and fears of the all the years are met in thee tonight*, we’d do well to remember that though our circumstances and situations are many and very different one from another, still our hopes—for peace, health, security, education, love, freedom—and fears—of war, violence, loneliness, oppression—are few and very similar.

If we’re going to celebrate this mishmash of a pagan holiday celebrating the birth of a Middle Eastern Jew who would become the central figure of Christianity after his death, let us do so with messy and expansive joy, with courageous cheer, with deep and prayerful good will toward all.


### ***Caring Committee: Reaching Out***
