A View From the Hill

I walked into the screen porch recently and found a Monarch butterfly clinging to the inside of the screen. There was no mystery about how it got there; it was pretty miraculous all the same.

Weeks earlier the girls found some Monarch caterpillars and we hastily dropped them into plastic take-out containers with some milkweed and a twig or two (after the girls played with them during their bedtime story, letting them crawl up and down their arms and in and out of their belly-buttons). The next day we left for our ten days in Iowa. I expected dead caterpillars (or worse, missing caterpillars, dead somewhere in the house) when we returned home. Instead there was one caterpillar crawling around nearby, one brown and oozing chrysalis, and one large, bright green chrysalis. It was lying loose at the bottom of the container—unattached to twig or leaf. The girls took it out, passed it from hand to hand, dropped it on the kitchen table, and photographed it before finally dropping it back into the container. The next day the girls moved on to their new foster home, and I put the container out on the screen porch to deal with later. And promptly forgot it.

Until one day there it was. An aptly majestic Monarch, wings still a bit crumpled, clinging to the inside of the screen. I gave it a few hours to flex and dry its wings, then shooed it out the door. I hope it is one of the Monarchs I see flitting around the churchyard each day.

I don't know if Monarchs are making a comeback; I know one survived the girls' roughly enthusiastic handling and my inattention. As I noted on Facebook that day, nature doesn't require my attention to do what it does, be what it is.

Some living creatures, however, namely the human kind, do require our active attention in order to survive and thrive. Foster kids, kids in general, parents of all kinds, ministers, teachers, siblings, widows, newlyweds, teenagers, all of us—like Monarch caterpillars, chrysalises, butterflies—we're more fragile than our hardy, energetic behavior suggests and we're stronger and more resilient than our delicate appearance suggests. That makes it hard to know what kind of attention to offer. Saying, "I see you and that makes my heart glad" is always a good place to start.

Church is back in full swing. I'll see you there and my heart will be very glad.
