In Honor of Roberta Case

Nora Church recently received a memorial donation in honor of Roberta Case, who died in November 2014 in Oregon. Roberta's great-grandparents, Ole and Ragnhild Pladsen were founders of Nora Free Christian Church (original name) nearly 135 years ago. Her grandparents were John and Oline Pladsen and her parents Ole and Edith Pladsen. The memorial was given by her friend and cousin, Karen Bartig. Karen is the great-great granddaughter of Ole and Ragnhild, great-granddaughter of Syver and Louisa Pladsen, granddaughter of Oscar and Florence Pladsen, and daughter of Warren and Phyllis Pladsen. Karen notes that Roberta was "the kindest of people, always genuinely positive and cheerful no matter what the situation, and she is missed by many." A celebration of her life took place at Atkinson Memorial Unitarian Universalist Church in Oregon City, Oregon.

While we gratefully appreciate donations such this, notes such as the one Karen sent, reminding us of the rich history and far-reaching connections of our congregation are the true gift.

UUSC-UUA Act for the Global Refugee Crisis

The Unitarian Universalist Service Committee (UUSC) and the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) remain gravely concerned about the global refugee crisis and are committed to taking action. Two new initiatives have been formed. First, a special UUSC-UUA Refugee Crisis Fund, with the goal of raising \$250,000. Secondly, a petition drive to pressure the Obama administration to substantially raise the number of refugees admitted into the United

States to 200,000. Donations to the UUSC-UUA Refugee Crisis Fund will go directly to partners operating on the ground in countries receiving refugees. 
Jared Brown, family member of the Beckens/ Brudelies, has one more thing to cross off of his bucket list. Not that having a news segment that he was featured in win an Emmy was on the list, but lists are meant to grow. Jared graduated on June 9, 2014. He made it his goal to walk across the stage at graduation with the rest of his class. He worked for three years towards this goal. Jared has primary dystonia, an involuntary movement disorder, which has taken its toll on him and made activities that we don't think twice about doing with ease, very difficult for him. There was much fanfare surrounding the rumor that Jared was going to walk. Three or more newspapers did feature articles about the big day and the local TV station wanted to cover Jared's story. They filmed at our house prior to leaving for graduation and then again at graduation. Jared walked across the stage, just like he planned, to a roaring crowd and a standing ovation. It was a memorable night. Fastforward to December and life is back to normal. except Jared's story was chosen as one of the most memorable of 2014 so they did another segment on The three segments together got the title him. "Rising above a Disability". This was submitted to the PA Broadcaster Association and the Emmy nomination committee for consideration. To make a long story short, the segment won both awards. Jared was also in a video for the Tri for Inclusion, a triathlon where kids with and without disabilities compete along side of each other and there are no sidelines.
