And this is one of those years. Leap-day babies the world around will be turning a year older for the first time since [2012] And we all get an extra day. What will you do with yours?

In her popular poem *The Summer Day* Mary Oliver asks, *Doesn't everything die at last, and too soon?/Tell me, what is it you plan to do/with your one wild and precious life?*

It is a good question and there are many potential benefits to planning, but a life is (usually) a huge chunk of time. I've run into a few people now and again who have life plans, stretching from college majors through grad. school programs to entry level jobs and on up the career ladder, with parallel lines for apartments, starter homes and dream homes, or dating, marriage, children, retirement, or get a job, save some money, travel, get another job, repeat. Most of us, however, are better with small spans of time.

Which brings us back to February 29. An extra day is a fairly plan-able chunk of time. Of course Leap Day this year falls in the middle of the week, so that might reduce our flexibility. It's not like Leap Day is a day out of time--something other than Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday or Saturday; some completely other 24 hours totally at our disposal, free of routine and expectation. Still, it is an extra day. And we can chose to make it significant in some small way.

What pleasure or task have you been putting off? A drawer to be organized? A letter to be hand-written? A special book put aside to savor when the time opens up? A conversation with your child or parent or partner? A meal you love but never want to fuss with on an ordinary day? A will that needs to be written--or an advanced health care directive?

Whatever it is February 29 might be just the day to do it. Even if the extra-ness of the day seems mostly imaginary, still it might be just the prompting we each need to get done something that we never seem to find time for.

And if even an extra day seems too much to plan, come June 30 we get a Leap Second. Tell me, what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious (extra) second?
