A View From the Hill

Roaming UU season has begun again.

During this roaming season, with long, light-filled days and icefree roads, may you encounter beings who invite you to see your habitual surroundings with renewed awe and appreciation. And may you be such an invitation to others along the paths of your own roaming.

Notes on June Services

The Annual Meeting of Nora Church will follow immediately upon conclusion of the service on **Sunday, June 5.** We will elect trustees, approve the 2016/2017 budget, discuss possible alternative starting time for Sunday services, and undertake any other business that comes before the congregation.

The President of the congregation will **not** entertain a motion to change start times at this meeting. Rather, a lively discussion of the best time to start Sunday services will allow the board consider the matter at greater length sometime in the coming year, with input from the congregation on such questions as:

- would an earlier start time generate more frequent attendance among younger members (and others) who like to get on with other Sunday activities before midday?
- would an earlier start time so severely cut into practice time that a choir would no longer be feasible?
- are there creative alternatives to weekly, preservice choir practice? simpler pieces that could be practiced one Sunday after service

and sung in service the next week? others?

- what would an earlier start time mean in terms of potluck?
- how would an earlier start time affect our more far-flung members?
- has time and experience proven conclusively that 10:30 is the only acceptable start time for our service?

The service on **Sunday**, **June 12** will include our annual Flower Ceremony. Please remember to bring a flower or flowering branch for each member of your family attending service that morning. You won't want to miss the beauty we create together and then carry home with us that morning.

Our service on Sunday, June 19, will take place at Lake Hanska Park, in the shelter located near the fishing pier. Coffee will be available from about 10:00 on. Service at 10:30 followed by potluck lunch. Some of the guys will fire up the grills. Please bring a salad or side dish or dessert, place settings for you and your family, sunscreen, bug repellent and other weatherrelated necessities. Seating for "church" and lunch will be at picnic tables. Bring along a lawn chair for greater comfort!! Please plan to stay after lunch for boat rides and fishing off the pier.
