A View From the Hill

The shelter director at NUMAS Haus recently told Rotary Club how she landed what she considers her dream job. She described her vocational background and her educational background. She mentioned that when someone suggested that she apply for the job she had already missed the application deadline, and that she didn't have the exact preferred qualifications for the job. Still, she said, she was encouraged to apply. Within nine days of submitting her application she had the job. (And, not coincidentally, as a NUMAS Haus board member, I can tell you that she was our dream applicant and is our dream founding shelter director.)

In 1939, before he and Martha (his wife and partner) accepted the call to leave their children for many months and imperil their own lives, Unitarian minister Waitstill Sharp asked how many other ministers had been offered this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to put their faith into action by going to the Sudetenland to help refugees fleeing the Nazis. He was told "Seventeen".

Presbyterian minister and writer Frederick Buechner has said, "The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet."

It's not easy to find—that place where our deep gladness meets the world's deep hunger. Sometimes a lot of other people have to turn down a job—one that will sate the world's deep hunger—before we get a shot at it. Sometimes we have to go for a job or an opportunity—one that taps our deep gladness—even though we don't have the qualifications and have missed the deadline. Yet the obligation is ours to engage in that dogged and uncertain avocational job search—to say yes where others have said no, to say send me now when others say you're too late, to say send me anyway when others say you're not qualified. The universe is waiting for us to discover and take up the task that is uniquely ours, because the world's hunger is so deep it can only be met by our individual gladnesses, all of them together.

It's a daunting and noble endeavor, finding the place where God call us. Consider church the avocational job resource center, where we gather to search the world's help wanted postings and tweak our resumes and exchange tips—to the end that each of us alone and all of us together might change the world and be changed by it.

Energy Assistance Program

Many local families and individuals find it difficult to pay their monthly energy bills. The Energy Assistance Program provides a grant for income-eligible households which can help defray some of these costs. This leaves more of the family resources available for other expenses. We can also assist households in crisis situations with disconnect notices or when they are almost out of heating fuel. Grants are paid directly to the vendor on their behalf.

Households can request an application by calling MVAC at 507-345-6822 or 800-767-7139 or by downloading it from their website mnvac.org. Applications are currently available, with funds becoming available later in the year, generally mid-late November. The program ends May 31st, 2017. Talk to Lisa for additional information.
