### **A View From the Hill**

As most of you will know by now, I'll be on sabbatical for the next four months. I'll return to the tasks of ministry here at Nora Church on May 1, 2017.

I wrote a similar message at this time last year as I prepared to leave for the first two months of my sabbatical. It's a bit unusual (though not unheard of) to split one sabbatical into two segments and to spread those segments over two consecutive church years. But Nora Church has never been afraid to stray from the usual way of doing things.

From breaking away from Linden and Lake Hanska Lutheran Churches and joining a American Unitarian Association to allowing women to vote and serve in leadership positions to erecting a wind tower and turbine to produce electricity, be kind to the environment and serve as example and encouragement to other churches—Nora does what suits its members' needs and its institutional values.

Our current sabbatical set-up allowed me to begin sabbatical right on time last January while also giving me the opportunity to apply for special funding for the second segment. The funding didn't come through but, as is so often the way of the universe, the split sabbatical arrangement now allows me four months to settle into the unexpected blessing of motherhood.

And for you, the congregation, you benefit from the fresh perspective of many and diverse voices form the pulpit while not having your minister absent for the larger portion of a single church year.

I'm deeply grateful for the willing and can-do spirit of Nora that thus serves us all so well.

Take good care of yourselves and one another. I'll see you in May.

Guest Speaker Hank Campbell received his Master of Divinity degree from United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities in 1983. 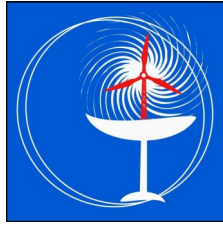
When the song of the angels is stilled,

### *NUMAS Haus Needs Volunteers*

NUMAS Haus needs volunteers to staff the house at least one three hour shift/month. Volunteers make sure residents and children are in a safe environment, interact with residents and children providing examples of good decision making skills, and contact the shelter coordinator in response to emergencies and resident problems and issues. ### *Energy Assistance Program*

Many local families and individuals find it difficult to pay their monthly energy bills. The Energy Assistance Program provides a grant for income-eligible households which can defray some of these costs, leaving more of the family resources available for other expenses. We can also assist households in crisis situations with disconnect notices or when they are almost out of heating fuel. Grants are paid directly to the vendor on their behalf.

Households can request an application by calling MVAC at 507-345-6822 or 800-767-7139 or by downloading it from their website [mnvac.org](http://mnvac.org). Applications are currently available, with funds becoming available later in the year, generally mid-late November. The program ends May 31st, 2017.
