The church is erecting a wind turbine near Mount Pisquah Cemetery that will provide electricity for its building. If excess energy is produced, it will be sold to Alliant Energy. The project, which is estimated to cost \$94,000, is partially financed by a \$20,000 grant from United States Department of Agriculture. The clean energy that will be produced by the wind turbine coincides with the members' beliefs and values about lessening their carbon footprint on the earth.
